REFLECTION

This week we reflect of one of the virtues;
the *Virtue of Fortitude*, or being brave.

To be brave means you have to be prepared to suffer,
which means that you have to be *able* to suffer.

Interestingly, an Angel can't be brave because he can't suffer!

When you're brave, you suffer not for the *sake* of suffering,
(which is just stupid) but you are prepared to suffer, because
something or someone that matters to you is under threat.

If you're being brave for someone else, then that is obviously an
example of the virtue of Fortitude, because we are all valuable.

But if you're being brave for *something* else, then that
'something' has to be really important, really valuable.

So first, before being brave, you need to know what *really*
matters, and for that you need the Virtue of Prudence.

Prudence teaches us the *real* value of things.

And then you need to be brave for a *just cause*, so you need the
Virtue of Justice. These virtues come before Fortitude.

Christian Martyrdom is the perfect example of the Virtue of
Fortitude: The Martyr is battling against evil itself, and he
wins the battle against evil by losing his life.

REFLECTION

If you're a *daredevil*, you're not brave.

That's because what we mean by a 'daredevil' isn't someone who challenges or 'dares' the devil; He isn't fighting a battle against evil. Instead, daredevils behave as if everything, even *trivial*, silly things, are just as valuable as *important* things, so they end up thinking that nothing has real value.

We can say that the definition of a daredevil, is

Risking everything for nothing,

and it is very close to the definition of a coward, which is

Risking nothing for everything,

because the coward thinks nothing is worth fighting for.

Such people have no values;

They end up living unbalanced lives.

They get blown this way and that by the winds of fate
the winds that bring fortune and misfortune.

They run away when they're challenged with real evil.

Let us pray for ourselves, that we are given the Virtues of *Prudence* and *Justice*, to help us decide what matters in life, and the Virtue of *Fortitude* to help us to bear witness to what really matters.
